The Virginia High School Bearcat Band welcomes you to the 2000 District VII Band Festival. This is the first concert festival of the millennium and will include 27 bands from across Southwest Virginia. The groups are middle school and high school bands playing a wide variety of music.

This is only a festival; not a competition. Bands do not compete against each other. They are judged on how well they perform. On stage, bands will perform three prepared selections (one warm-up march and two pieces from a list of music graded by the Virginia Band and Orchestra Director's Association – VBODA). While performing, the bands will be judged on a range of categories, including, but not limited to: intonation, technique, balance, interpretation, blend, and the overall musical effect. After their stage performance, bands will proceed to another venue to be judged on their sight-reading capabilities. The sight-reading selections are newly published pieces that few or no bands have ever played.

Mr. Pete Hodges Stage Judge

Mr. Hodges received his BS degree in 1971 from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and his MA from East Tennessee State University in Johnson City in 1979. He taught 2 years in Johnson City, 6 years at Greenville Middle School, and has served as Director of the marching, concert, and jazz bands at Greeneville High School since 1979. His groups have received numerous Superior ratings in marching and concert festivals. He has served as a clinician and adjudicator of marching and concert events in Tennessee, Virginia, and Kentucky.

Pete is a member of Music Educator National Conference, the National Band Association, Phi Beta Mu, Tennessee Music Educators Association, and the East Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association where he has served on the Board of Directors almost continuously since 1975. He currently serves as Executive Secretary-Treasurer.

Ms. Patricia Rhoten Stage Judge

Ms. Rhoten is a native of Rogersville, Tennessee where she makes h home. She earned a Bachelor of Instrumental Music from East Tennessee St University and a Master of Music Education from the University of Tenness She has done additional graduate work at U.T.

Ms. Rhoten has taught in Tennessee, Georgia, and North Carolina. While in North Carolina, Ms. Rhoten held the office of Junior High Honor E Tryout Chairman from 1990-93. In 1990, Gaston County honored her with a V.I.P. award. Ms. Rhoten is a member of the East Tennessee School Band at Orchestra Association, Music Educators National Conference, the National Education Association, the Tennessee Education Association, and Delta Kar Gamma Sorority. She has in the teaching profession for 22 years. She is presently the band director at Rogersville Middle School and assists during marching season at Cherokee High School.

Mr. James Spinazzola Stage Judge

Mr. James Spinazzola is the Associate Director of Bands and Profes of Saxophone at Tennessee Technological University, located in Cookeville, Tennessee. His duties include the direction of the "Golden Eagle" Marching Band, the University Concert Band, and the "Golden Eagle Brass", as well a the saxophone studio. He received a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from Duquesne University, and a Master's Degree in Wind Conducting from University of Colorado at Boulder, where he was a student of Allan McMun He has taught at the high school level, and has earned numerous awards as a saxophonist, most recently from Downbeat magazine.

Mr. William J. Svec, Jr..... Sight-reading Judge

William J. Svec, Jr., a native of Pittsburgh, has taught in Virginia sir 1965. Prior to coming to Virginia, Mr. Svec was Director of the Marching B at Morehead State University in Kentucky. In Virginia, he has taught at Geo Wythe High School, Wytheville; Cave Spring High and Junior High Schools and Northside High and Middle Schools. Active as a clinician and guest conductor throughout Virginia and the region, he has served as an officer of VBODA and is a past-president of the American School Band Director's Association. Since his retirement in 1995, he has remained active in the community and schools assuming a part-time music position with Ferrum College; and for the past three years as Coordinator of Music for the Roanok County Schools.
