

The Virginia High School Bearcat Band welcomes you to the 2002 District VII Band Festival. This year's concert festival will include 24 bands from across Southwest Virginia. The groups are middle school and high school bands playing a wide variety of music.

This is only a festival, not a competition. Bands do not compete against each other. They are judged on how well they perform. On stage, bands will perform three prepared selections (one warm-up march and two pieces from a list of music graded by the Virginia Band and Orchestra Director's Association – VBODA). While performing, the bands will be judged on a range of categories, including, but not limited to: intonation, technique, balance, interpretation, blend, and the overall musical effect. After their stage performance, bands will proceed to another venue to be judged on their sight-reading capabilities. The sight-reading selections are newly published pieces that few or no bands have ever played.

III - Good

II - Excellent

Mr. Reginald Purvis Stage Judge

Reginald Purvis is the Director of Bands at George Washington High School in Danville, Virginia. A native of Lynchburg, Virginia, Mr. Purvis holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from East Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina. Under his direction, the music programs at George Washington High School has consistently won numerous superior ratings in marching and concert captions at contests throughout Virginia and the Eastern United States. He is a member of the National Music Educators Association, the National Band Association, the Virginia Music Educators Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Professional Music Fraternity, and the National Education Association. He has also served as an adjudicator for contests and music festivals in Virginia and North Carolina.Mr. Purvis resides in Danville with his wife Renee and their son Matthew.

Mr. Mac Bowman Stage Judge

Mac is a native of Bristol, Tennessee. He was a member of the Vance Junior High School Band, directed by his father, the late Edwin M. Bowman, and the Tennessee High School Band, directed by the late L. Howard Nicar Jr. he attended East Tennessee State University and received his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. He received his Master of Science degree from Troy State University in Troy, Alabama. He was Director of Bands for ten years at Halls High School in Knoxville, Tennessee. He has served as a member of the Executive Board of The East Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association. In June of 2001, Mac retired from McEachern High School, in Powder Springs, Georgia. He served as Director of Bands and Chairmen of Fine Arts at McEachern for twenty-three years. His Symphonic Bands have received consistent Superior ratings at both the East Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association and The Georgia Music Educators Festivals. The McEachren Symphonic Band has performed at the Southeastern United States High School Band Clinic and the University of Georgia "Janfest" Band Clinic. His marching bands have won Superior ratings and Grand Championships at marching band festivals throughout the south. Mac has been active for many years as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor, in the United States and abroad.

Dr. Joe Allison Stage Judge

Dr. Joseph H. Allison is currently Associate Professor in the School of Music at Eastern Kentucky University, serving as the Director of Bands and Graduate Conducting Activities, as well as Director of the Stephen Collins Foster Music Camps. He previously taught in the public schools for eighteen years and serves as an adjudicator, clinician and consultant for concert, marching and jazz events throughout North America, Europe and Japan. Allison has held professional affiliations with the CBDNA, NBA (Board of Directors), ETSBOA, SCMEA, MENC, ASBDA, IAJE, PAS (Advisory Board) BOA (Advisory Board), Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Beta Mu and Phi Mu Alpha Under his direction, the Sumter (SC) High School Bands were the first awarded both the Sudler Flag and Sudler Shield for concert and marching excellence. Dr. Allison's personal honors include the National Band Association's "Citation of Excellence", the John Philip Sousa Foundation's "Sudler Order of Merit" as well as achievement awards from both the International Association of Jazz Educators and the Percussive Arts Society. He is listed in Who's Who of American Educators, Outstanding Young Men of America, and has been honored in five resolutions of the South Carolina State Legislature. Dr. Allison is also a laureate of both the Order of the Palmetto from the state of South Carolina, and Kentucky Colonel, from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Mr. David Vail Sight-reading Judge

David Vail has served as a band director and music teacher in the Virginia Public Schools teaching at the high school and middle school levels. Recently retired after 34 years service David continues to be actively involved in music education. He has appeared as adjudicator, clinician and performer throughout the Mid-Atlantic States. Mr. Vail's musical compositions and arrangements have been performed by school and college bands as well as the Miss Virginia and Miss America Orchestras. As a woodwind performer, David has played with a variety of groups including Mill Mountain Theatre pit orchestra, Roanoke Symphony Orchestra and many local jazz and big bands. He served as band director in the Smyth County Schools (Chilhowie High 1965-71), Roanoke County Schools (Northside High and William Byrd High), Roanoke City Schools (Woodrow Wilson Junior High and Patrick Henry High). David received his formal training at Concord College (B.S. 1965) and Radford College (M.S. 1970). Mr. Vail currently resides with his wife in Botetourt County.
