
VBODA District VII Concert Assessment

March 12 & 13, 2014 Virginia High School Bristol, VA



Virginia High School welcomes you to the 2014 VBODA District VII Concert Band Assessment. Gary Skeen and Ben Parks, along with Virginia High School, are proud to host this event, which includes 29 bands from Southwest Virginia. These groups range from middle school bands to high school bands performing a wide variety of music.

This is an assessment: not a competition. Bands do not complete against each other, but they are judged on a variety of criteria that complies with the Virginia Standards of Learning for Music Education.

On stage, bands will perform three to four prepared selections. The first selection is a march, while the remaining selections are graded music. Music is graded from 1-6, with 1 being the easiest and 6 being the hardest. This music is graded by Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors' Association. While performing, the band will be judged on a range of categories including, but not limited to, intonation, technique, balance, interpretation, blend, and overall musical effect. After their stage performance, bands will go to another venue to be judged on their sight-reading capabilities. The sight-reading selections are newly published pieces that have not been available for performances.

Vincent J. Tornello ------Stage Judge

Vincent J. Tornello is an accomplished musician, educator, and arranger based in Charlottesville, Virginia.

Vincent is a product of Oceanside Public Schools, Long Island, New York. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the Shenandoah Conservatory of Music and a Master of Education degree from the University of Virginia.

Vincent began his career as an educator in 1972 at Lane High School in Charlottesville. For two years he directed the marching band, organized and directed the Jazz Ensemble, and served as assistant concert band director. Over the course of the following 37 years, the Charlottesville High School band excelled under his direction until his retirement in 2009. The program earned countless honors and accolades, and proudly holds a number of state concert and marching band records.

He is a past-president of the Virginia Chapter of the National Jazz Educators Association, and a past-president of the Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association. Vincent has served as treasurer of the Virginia Music Educators Association for the past 24 years. He is also a member of the National Association for Music Education, Alpha Phi Omega National Service Fraternity and Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity. He is an adjunct saxophone instructor for the University of Virginia Wind Ensemble.

As a professional musician, Vincent has performed for live radio broadcasts as well as studio recording sessions, in addition to numerous other performances in Virginia and the New York metropolitan area.

Joseph Blaha-----Stage Judge

Award winning composer, Joseph Blaha, received his doctorate in composition from the University of Oklahoma where he studied with Michael Hennagin. His works have been performed throughout the U. S. and in Europe and South America. A former trombonist with The United States Army Band (Pershing's Own), Washington, D.C. and euphoniumist with the Karl King Band, he has held teaching positions at colleges and universities in Iowa, Texas, California, Oklahoma and Virginia. He is presently associate professor of music

and the director of bands at Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia where he lives with his wife, Sara, and dogs No. 5 and No. 6 (Belle and Jenny).

Carole Grooms-----Stage Judge

Carole Smith Grooms is a native of Winchester, TN. She attended Tennessee Technological University as a music major with piano emphasis, earning the Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education. She holds a Master of Arts in Music from the University of Hawaii, Manoa. 2011-2012 will begin Ms. Grooms' 28th year of teaching. Prior to employment in the Franklin Special School District in 1990, she was band director at Moore County High School, in Lynchburg, TN, and music teacher at Harris Middle School, in Shelbyville, TN. She also served as an assistant director to the Franklin High School Marching Band, 1990-1995.

Ms. Grooms is a member of Williamson County Band Director's Association, Middle Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association (serving as President 2011-2013), Tennessee Music Educators Association, Tennessee Bandmasters Association, American School Band Directors Association (currently Southeast Region V Representative to the National Executive Board 2010-2013), Music Educators National Conference, and Phi Beta Mu fraternity. She is also a member of the educational advisory committee to the Nashville Jazz Orchestra. Ms. Grooms currently performs with the Nashville Wind Ensemble on flute. In the past, she performed as a member of the Nashville Flute Ensemble, Tennessee Valley Winds (Murfreesboro Community Band), and the Nashville Symphony Chorus and Chamber Chorus.

Jeff Kleiber-----Sight-Reading Judge

Jeffrey P. Kleiber has been teaching in the Wake County Public School System since August of 2010. Originally from Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, Mr. Kleiber began playing the trumpet at the age of ten. While in high school (in Tennessee), he was selected to be part of the Tennessee All-State Jazz Band in 2001. He received the bachelor of music degree in music education from East Tennessee State University in 2007, where he completed his student teaching with Perry Elliott and Christopher Lockhart and performed trumpet with the Johnson City Symphony. Mr. Kleiber earned the master of music degree in music education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro in 2012, where he studied conducting with Dr. John Locke. He has been teaching in the public schools (North Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia) since 2007, and his bands have consistently earned superior and excellent ratings at both concert and marching festivals. Mr. Kleiber was the recipient of the Cary Chamber of Commerce's Educator of the Year Discovery Award in 2013.

In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Mr. Kleiber is sought after as a marching band adjudicator, honor band conductor, and leadership presenter for

bands in North Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia. He is a member of the National Association for Music Education, the National Band Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. Mr. Kleiber serves as the fine arts department chair, electives department chair, mentor teacher, and leadership committee chair for Reedy Creek Middle School and the band department co-chair for the Wake County Public School System. Currently, Mr. Kleiber is completing coursework toward the doctor of philosophy degree in music education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.
